A Family Night Special— A Geologist on the Back of a Dogsled

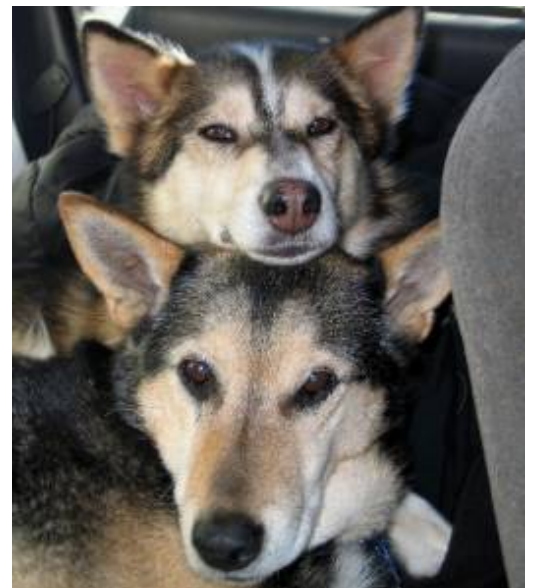
TC Wait Colorado Geological Survey

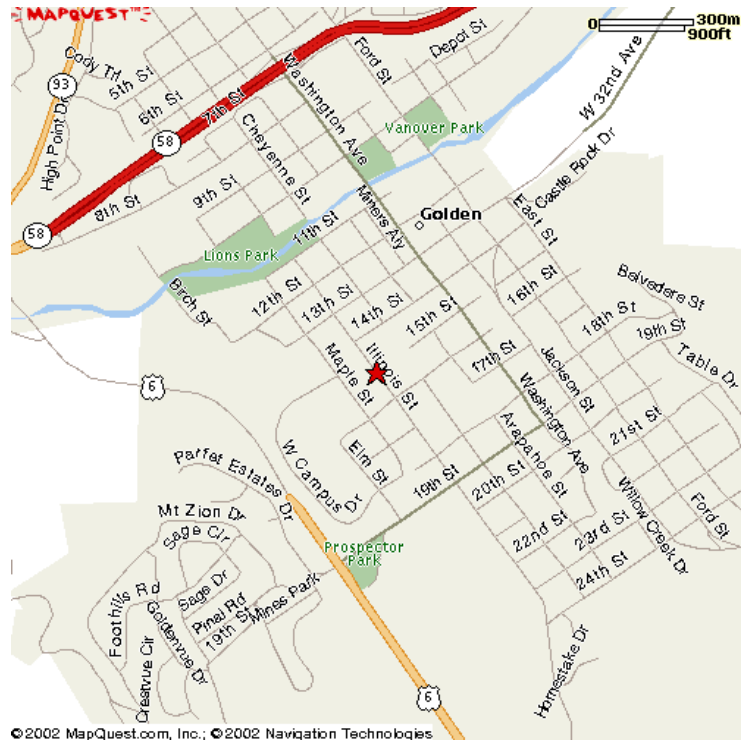
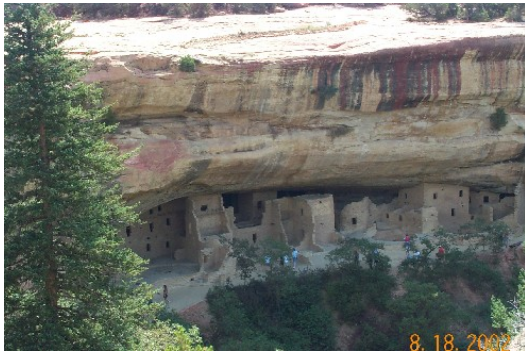
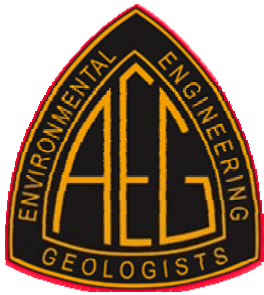
